ORDER DISMISSING CASE

This is a civil rights action filed by a prisoner who, at the time of filing, was confined in the Tarrant County Jail in Fort Worth, Texas. Plaintiff states that he is a Special Agent with the Defense Security Service, assigned to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the Defense Contract Management Agency. *See* Amended Complaint, ECF No. 7. He brings a variety of claims against Attorney General Ken Paxton, the State of Texas, the Tarrant County Sheriff, and the City of Fort Worth. *Id.* The relief he seeks is unspecified. *Id.*

On September 18, 2017, the Court entered orders on Plaintiff's motion for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* and his motion for appointment of counsel. *See* ECF Nos. 9 & 10. The orders were mailed to Plaintiff at the address provided in his original complaint, which is the same address provided in his amended complaint. *See* ECF Nos. 1 & 7. On September 28, 2017, Plaintiff's copies of the orders were returned to the Clerk of Court as undeliverable. Stamped on the envelope are the words "RETURN TO SENDER . . . NOT IN TARRANT COUNTY JAIL." *See* ECF No. 11.

Because Plaintiff's current address is unknown, this case cannot proceed. Upon review of the complaint, the Court is not able to determine whether Plaintiff's claims will be time-barred upon

dismissal. Therefore, this dismissal is without prejudice to Plaintiff's right to reopen the case by filing a motion to reopen within thirty days of the date of this order. Plaintiff must also provide his current address.

For the foregoing reasons it is **ORDERED** that Plaintiff's complaint is **DISMISSED** without prejudice.
